- Note 4 The issue of an import licence under the provisions of the Diseases of Animals Act 1966 and the Rabies (Importation, Landing and Movement of Animals) Order 1972 does not absolve the holder from any requirements under the Wildlife Act 1976 or the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES).
